National Prescription Drug Take Back Day

The next DEA National Prescription Drug Take Back Day is happening October 23 and will be located in the parking lot at the Methodist Church, 109 E. Broadway, Goldendale, WA, 10 am to 2 pm.

It is sponsored by the Coalition Preventing Abuse in Klickitat County along with the Klickitat County Sheriff's office and community partners. For more information call Sunday Sutton at (509) 281-2330.



What medications will be accepted? Any prescription and over-the-counter medications including pills, liquids, and inhalers will be accepted.

What about sharps and syringes? NO. Sharps or syringes will not be accepted at this event.

How are medications collected and disposed of? All prescriptions and over-the-counter medication collected are safely incinerated by the D.E.A.

Safe disposal of opioid medications at a take back location not only prevents opioid misuse and overdose deaths, it's also best for the environment. Opioids thrown out in the trash or toilet can threaten wildlife and the drinking water. In fact, scientists have found medicines in Pacific Northwest water and soils. Even at low levels, these medicines can harm the health of our environment. *Source: Washington State Department of Ecology
